It is envisaged that it will include two additional major theatres, central sterile department, post operative re covery unit, theatre staff rooms and ancilliary rooms.

It will provide additional staff amenities to meet the growing need of the expanded staff and a bulk store to steralise stores within the hospital.

Beyond this next stage it is forseen that the future development of this hospital would include an additional ward block and the centralisation of all ancilliary services.
