Matron a true leader

NURSES who trained at Gosford Hospital 1961-72 may well remember the starched uniform of their matron Iris Inskip who died at Lismore last month.

Hundreds of babies born during those 11 years in Gosford would have been cared for by Miss Inskip, who was also a captain in the 2/5th at Greta.

She was born on January 28, 1908, at Bemboka.

Former Gosford Hospital chief executive officer Neville Boyce worked with Miss Inskip and they continued their friendship after she left the hospital.

"Iris Inskip was held in high esteem by all her staff and friends and there are

many in the local community who remember her with great respect," Mr Boyce said.

"Her time at Gosford was the beginning of a period of population growth on the Central Coast and great expansion of the hospital services.

"Matron was a true leader - sometimes the army captain – but a very proud nurse in the starched veil and uniform and her goals were always to provide an excellent nursing service to the sick patients in the hospital.

"She was also a very kind and caring person and I am sure many of those trainees would have a story of her personal interest in their welfare.'

Miss Inskip is survived by her greatnieces Gillian Wall and Kathryn Taylor and their families.

'She died on July 24 and her funeral was held at Parkview Funeral Home, Lismore, on Thursday.
