OSPITAL'S RO

The Gosford District Hospital has a vital role to play in the hospital system of New South Wales.

This was stated yesterday by the Minister for Health, the Hon. A. H. Jago, M.L.A., who tomorrow (Saturday) officially opens extensions and equipment at the hospital, worth an estimated \$1,200,000.

In a special statement to e "Express" Mr. Jago said he was looking forward performing the official opening of the O Hospital extensions.

Mr. Jago commented:

"The hospital is a key ik in the State system as link in halfway between Newcastle and Hornsby and not only does it provide for the hospital needs of Gosford and surrounding communities, but is also called upon to play a very important role in the care of the victims of accidents that occur all too frequently on the Highway between New-

castle and Hornsby.

"Indeed, one of the features of these extensions is the provision of a mod-ern, up-to-date Casualty Department, complete with reception area, examination cubicles, Operating Theatre, Xray and orthopaedic faci-lities, as well as an Obserwell as an Obser-

vation Ward.

Casualty facilities

"I am confident that these improved and enlarged casualty facilities will be of considerable benefit those who, unfortunately, will require to be brought

"Of course these extensions contain much more than a Casualty Departthan a Casualty Depart-ment. They provide an ad-ditional 65 ward beds, which are urgently needed to meet the increased demands for hospital services in the area consequent upon the growth in population.
"A new kitchen block

has also been provided to-gether with a new boiler house and laundry. The modern hospital is depen-

dent more and more on an adequate supply of steam. The boiler house and kit-chen have been built of sufficient size to cope with the full development of the Hospital.

"Ultimately it is envisaged that the Gosford District Hospital will be de trict Hospital will be developed to a capacity of some 250-300 beds, and it is hoped that the development will proceed without delay. Already the next stage of its development, which includes renovations of the older section of the hospital, is in hand and tenders for this work have been called called.

"The cost of the extensions that are being opened on Saturday is of the order of \$1m. This cost is in-clusive of all necessary equipment.

Important

"The provision of such a large sum of public moneys clearly indicates how important the Gosford District Hospital is considered by the responsible authorities.

"These extensions, I am sure, will greatly facilitate the worthy work of the doctors, the nurses and the tors, the nurses and the staff of the Hospital in caring for the sick and the injured.

"It would be remiss of me if I did not pay a high tribute to the doctors, the nurses and all the staff of the hospital for their industry and devotion to duty over the past years, working under cramped and diffi-

cult conditions.

"These extensions will assist their efforts considerably in maintaining their ably in maintaining the maintaining their ably in ma high standards of care for the sick and the injured."
